Tala competed in the junior section with her Spicy Hamburgers with Roasted Tomatoes and Tzatziki. She was up against some tough competition but competed confidently after weeks of practicing with Mrs Baxter and presented her tasty burger within the allotted hour. Louise then prepared her Greek Lamb Burger,



which contained her secret ingredient of a souvlaki spice mix, served with a skordalia mayonnaise, and salad on a toasted Turkish Pide bun.

Both students had been watched carefully by judges, Michael Coughlin from Pier 24, Fiona Carruthers the Beef and Lamb New Zealand Nutrition Manager and Tony Heptinstall, Programme Manager at the School of Hospitality at Otago Polytechnic.

FROM THE GUIDANCE COUNSELLOR INTERNET AND CELLPHONE SAFETY ALERT TO PARENTS

What is Sexting?
 Sexting, sending explicit pictures by cellphone, is gaining popularity among teenagers unaware they could be breaking the law.
A typical "sexting" episode begins with a boyfriend requesting an explicit or intimate photo of his girlfriend. It often ends with the girl's boyfriend resending her picture to countless friends, some of whom post these images on the Internet. **One of the problems with sexting is in distribution as once these images are sent out on the Internet they are impossible to get back.**

Also teenagers who sext are risking more than just embarrassment, they are risking breaking the law.
 "If you're under the age of 16, then you're producing sexual images of a young person and that's against the law in New Zealand," says Feguarty. Keith Manch from the Department of Internal Affairs says it does not matter who is doing it or whether it is voluntary or not, the issue is whether the image itself is objectionable.
 If caught, **sexters may be charged under three laws in New Zealand.** The most serious under the Films, Video and Classifications Act which comes with a maximum penalty of **10 years imprisonment.**

Bottom line for teenagers is if you don't feel safe - you aren't - talk to an adult you trust.
