Additionally this month the Finance Committee tabled and commented on the auditor's report of the College's 31 December 2010 financial statements.

The Finance Committee itself had met a couple of days earlier and at this meeting the Executive Officer had provided a more detailed report on the previous month's performance and the College's year to date situation. The Executive Officer forwards to the committee members the report in the days preceding this meeting and is then available to answer questions and provide clarification as required at this meeting. This committee formulates recommendations to be taken to the full board meeting.


CONGRATULATIONS TO LISA ADIE

RECIPE OF THE WEEK Turkish Pide

Preparation Time - 45 minutes
Cooking Time - 20 minutes

Ingredients (serves 6)

- 500g (3 1/3 cups) plain flour, sifted
- 1 tsp (7g/1 sachet) dried yeast
- 1 tsp sugar and salt
- 375ml (1 1/2 cups) warm water
- Olive oil, to grease
- 2 tsp sesame seeds, 1 tsp nigella seeds (optional)
- 1 egg yolk, 1 tbs olive oil



Method

1. Combine flour, yeast, sugar and salt in a bowl. Make a well in the centre, then add water. Use a wooden spoon to stir until combined, then use hands to bring the dough together in the bowl.
2. Turn the dough onto a lightly floured surface and knead for 15 minutes or until smooth and elastic. Brush a bowl with oil to grease. Place dough in the bowl and lightly coat with oil. Cover with a damp tea towel. Set aside in a warm, draught-free place for 1-1 1/2 hours or until the dough has doubled in size.
3. Place a baking tray on the middle shelf of the oven. Preheat oven to 230°C. Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface and cut in half. Flatten slightly with hands. Place each half on separate pieces of floured, non-stick baking paper. Cover with a damp tea towel and set aside in a warm, draught-free place for 15 minutes.
4. With floured hands, stretch each piece of dough into an 18 x 40cm rectangle. Leave on non-stick baking paper. Cover with a damp tea towel and set aside in a warm, draught-free place for 10 minutes. Combine sesame and nigella seeds.
5. Whisk egg yolk and oil in a bowl. Brush the top of each pide with egg mixture. Use floured fingers to make indentations on top and sprinkle with seeds. Remove tray from oven and slide 1 pide onto tray. Cook for 8-10 minutes or until golden. Cool on a wire rack. Repeat with 2nd pide.

AUSTRALIA/NEW ZEALAND BRAIN BEE COMPETITION

On Tuesday 28 June, nine Year 11 students spent the day at the Otago Museum competing in the annual **Brain Bee Competition**. This was the second round of the competition with the students, who came from all over the South Island, having to pass an on-line test earlier on in the year before being invited to compete in this round. KVC was well represented on the day with the third highest number of participating students, the most out of all the Dunedin schools. The students spent the morning sitting through tests and a group challenge, as well as talks from leading Neuroscientists. The KV students found the tests challenging but were good enough to make the finals of the group challenge where the top four groups competed for the prize. With the challenge over, the students spent some time exploring the museum. After lunch we all split up into groups and were given tours of different University Laboratories before coming back to the museum to watch the individual finals. Though none of the KV students made the final it was great to watch with a Riccarton High student winning the title. At the end of the day the team challenge winners were announced and we were thrilled to have achieved third place behind Motueka High and Riccarton High (The group challenge winner). This is a very tough competition and so to be the third best team in the South Island is quite an honour. Well done to our team members of **Injy Johnstone, Sean Fahey, Georgia Bradshaw and Luke Biggs** for doing so well and well done to the other Brain Bee members **Daniel Hunsche, Chris Sligo, Marama Walker, Josh Scott and Patrick Skinner**.
