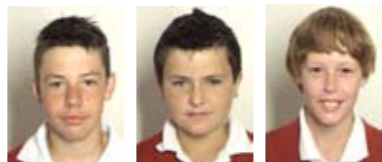

Dear Parents and Caregivers

**VODAFONE BLACKLIST**

**Staying safe with Vodafone Blacklist**

One of the growing trends is TXT bullying. If you suspect your child is a victim of this you can help them by letting them know about a free service from Vodafone called "Blacklist".

**For Students:**

If you are being bullied by TXT or receiving unwanted TXTs and PXTs you can block them with Vodafone Blacklist. Use Blacklist to create a list of mobile numbers you don't want to receive TXTs or PXTs from.

Vodafone Blacklist is free and exclusive to all Vodafone customers.

To set up Blacklist for the first time simply free TXT Blacklist Add (mobile number) to 713 sign or into My Account.

Manage your Vodafone Blacklist in My Account or free TXT the following commands to 713

- Add a number to Blacklist - BLACKLIST ADD (mobile number)
- View your Blacklist - BLACKLIST SHOW
- Remove a number - BLACKLIST REMOVE (mobile number)
- Remove all numbers - BLACKLIST REMOVE ALL
- Turn Blacklist off - BLACKLIST OFF
- Blacklist Help - BLACKLIST HELP

While Blacklist can help reduce the impact of TXT bullying it is not able to stop bullying from happening. If you are a victim of TXT bullying or receiving unwanted TXTs and PXTs read our information on responsible mobile use for helpful tips on how to handle it.

Using a mobile to harass or threaten someone is unacceptable and something can be done about it.

Prevention is always better than cure, and there are some simple steps you can take to help stop TXT bullying:

- Be careful about who you give out your number to.
- Don't give it to people you don't know and don't give out someone else's details without asking them first
- If you get a TXT from an unknown number or unwanted TXTs, don't reply.
- If you are getting unwanted messages the two ways you could handle this are:
- If you don't want to receive the messages at all you can use the Blacklist service - this allows you to stop receiving TXTs and PXTs from mobile numbers you select. See how you can get Blacklist.

Or you can continue to receive the messages. Here are a few things to remember:

- Don't reply to the messages.
- If you are concerned or upset by the message talk to someone you trust about it. If the messages are threatening take them to the police.
- If you get a number of messages that concern or upset you help is available. Keep a record of the messages and do not reply.
- If necessary there are a number of things Vodafone can do to help, like warning the bully, stopping TXTing from their account, temporarily barring their account or even permanently deactivating their account from our network.

To take action Vodafone require evidence of four calls or TXTs. Call Vodafone on 777 or you can free TXT 'Bully' to 4001 and Vodafone will get in touch.

**Remember** - if you are concerned or upset by a message, talk to someone you trust. If the messages are threatening take them to the police.
