# ENGLISH

## ENG 302

The course is suited for those students who need to work on achieving UE Literacy (4 reading and 4 writing credits) but also for others to try their hand at Level 3 standards. It suits students who have an interest in reading, writing and discussing but may need more time and teacher help to achieve their potential.
