GEOGRAPHY

GEO 101

This subject studies the world and the place of people in the world. You will study issues related to the natural landscape in different parts of the world and in New Zealand. You will study how extreme natural events such as earthquakes and hurricanes occur, and how people respond to these hazards. You will study ways in which people use landscapes for economic activities, and issues related to population and where people live.

An important aspect is learning to use and apply geographic skills and ideas. Many of these relate in a very practical way to other subjects and to studies and life beyond your school years.

There is a field trip in Term 3.
