In Level 1 History, students will gain *knowledge, skills and experiences to:*

- Understand how the causes and consequences of past events that are of significance to New Zealanders shape the lives of people and society.
- Understand how people's perspectives on past events that are of significance to New Zealanders differ.

Two main themes of **identity** and **independence** will be explored through in depth study of the following historical contexts:

- New Zealand's role in the world in the 20th century.
- Irish nationalism.
- Black civil rights in the USA
