HIS 201

In Level 2 History, students build on the knowledge and skills which they gained in Level 1, although it is not necessary for students to have completed a HIS101 course before they enter HIS201.



In the Level 2 course, students will gain *knowledge, skills and experience* to:

Understand how historical forces and movements have influenced the causes and consequences of events of significance to New Zealanders.

Understand how people's interpretations of events that are of significance to New Zealanders differ.

Two main themes of **rebellion and revolution** will be explored through in-depth study of the following historical contexts:

Vietnam and the New Zealand experience.

Russian revolution.

Māori leadership in the late 19th and early 20th century.
